Training programme on climate change for govt officers concludes

SHIMLA: Taking an initiative to address climate change, a three-day long training programme on 'Adaptation planning and implementation in Himachal Pradesh (Level 1)' concluded here on Sunday.

As challenges of addressing vulnerabilities and harnessing the opportunities thrown open by climate change was high on the agenda of the state government, the government is addressing the same by integrating climate change adaptation within its planning process.

Himachal Pradesh state council for science and technology and environment secretary SS Negi said various officers of different departments were being trained to combat the climate change and overcome the challenges and risk factors of climate change.

He added that department of environment, science and technology in the last one year, conducted a training needs assessment exercise across the state by visiting rural areas as well to understand the training programme needed.

It was found that there was an

immediate need to strengthen the capacities of the line departments towards implementation of adaptation actions, said Negi.

The objective of the training was to train senior-level officials to facilitate integration of climate change adaptation in existing programmes and towards implementation and if necessary retrofitting strategies and actions within the state action plan on climate change.

The training programme included essential but easy to understand modules focused on interpretation of climate trends and projections, assessment of impacts and vulnerabilities, identification of adaptation and steps towards monitoring and evaluation to ensure adjusted adaptation.

It also consisted of short presentation on each module followed by hands on classroom exercise, besides day-long field trip.

The objective was also to invite potential future trainers from departments and expose them to the training modules and methods of training. **HTC**
